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



Treffen 2016 - Squaw Valley, California

The first Treffen of Porsche Club of America was September, 2016. It was held at Squaw Valley, CA (Lake Tahoe). If you are unfamiliar with the area, Lake Tahoe is located both in Nevada and California. It is beautiful from either side.

So what is Treffen? It is Escape – but renamed and upscaled. While preparing to register for this event

(snacks and a drink included), full breakfast (not just pastries & coffee) for each day [Thursday thru Saturday], each night there was an event (which really turned out to be enough to constitute dinner with a beverage (soda, wine or beer, your choice).

Day trips were extra - just like Parade. We chose two excursions and took Friday off to explore



Lake Tahoe on our own.

Our first day trip was to a private car collection followed by a tour of The National Automobile Museum (The Harrah Collection) in Reno, NV. Both were exquisite. No pictures could be taken of the private collection but let it suffice, we only were able to look at one of three garages. The one we visited was the

"PORSCHE" garage. It was extremely nice.

Our second trip was to Nevada City, CA. This is a small artsyfartsy town that was quite entertaining. I enjoyed our lunch above an idyllic

stream. We followed lunch by exploring and taking in the sites.

Rumor had it that the trip around the lake took a day tour of approximately 5 to 6 hours with all the construction and two lane capabilities, one lane each way when possible. Lake Tahoe is a large freshwater

lake situated west of Carson City. It is 21.75 miles long and the area of the lake is 191.6 miles. We enjoyed our excursion that started prior to the construction crews setting up for the day.

We drove south and our first stop was at the parking lot to Vikingsholm. We were able to park, and using the

honesty system, pay our parking fee and

hike down to the main area along the switchbacks. Keith Copeland tells me it is much easier to access from the lake than to

hike it. Vikingsholm is a 38room mansion on the shores of Emerald Bay and is in the National Register of Historical Places. Vikingsholm was completed in 1929 and reflected Scandinavian style from Mrs. Lora Josephine Knight's trip through Scandinavia. I found the visitor's center very informative. Jim and I took our time and watched a few

videos about the mansion, how it was built and information about its residents. We found all of it to be very interesting. We then walked around the mansion (we opted out of the mansion tour) and the grounds – beautiful doesn't describe it well enough. Mrs. Knight had a small home on the island in Emerald Bay that she used to house tea parties. We enjoyed a very nice morning in Emerald Bay. After our hike back up the trail, we proceeded to South Lake Tahoe where we explored and had lunch.

The meals provided were inventive, enjoyable and delicious. Thursday's was a food truck offering eclectic tacos or salad. Friday night we had three courses of appetizers, which I thought were meals unto themselves, on the

lawn of Squaw Valley Resort. Saturday's dinner began with a trip up to the summit of the ski mountain via the



tram. Once there, there were beautiful views, good conversations and lots of friendly




people. The dinner was set up in a progressive manner. The plan was to enter the first room, have drinks and appetizers,

then move on to the next room where there was salad, and finally the last room where the main course and dessert were located. Attendees all have the option of an instructor to ride in the right seat and provide guidance and help improve your driving.

<u>March 18, 2017 from 12:45-5:00 p.m.</u>



The school will consist of a new slide presentation, will cover judging practices, and include a "handson" judging practice/review in small groups. Zone 8 Rules changes will be highlighted.



Until I drove the blue one...



I happened across a listing for a 2013 Aqua Blue 911 Carrera 4S Cabriolet with tan leather interior. It was truly a beautiful color combination and I scrolled through the photos slowly. Nice car, I thought as I closed the window and moved on to other things. But I couldn't shake that car from my brain.



I kept checking the site every few days and it was still there. Finally I had a free day and decided a trip to Scottsdale was in order. It never hurts to look, right? We've all read the comparison articles on the 997 vs. the 991, but I never quite believed how different the latest iteration was from the previous two. It feels a bit more like a grand touring car but you never feel like you're not in a Porsche 911. In short, it's everything the old generations were with some incredible improvements.

"C" is for Concours: Phoenix Flight 39



The Porsche Club of America - Southern Arizona Region to Turn 50 Some of Our History

In honor of this momentous occasion, SAR will have many special activities and will be taking a look back at its history. Let's start at the very beginning.

Coming from our humble beginnings, it's an honor to be the last active Charter Club member. Larry Randall ... is one of the few Porsche owners in Tucson who started the University Arizona Porsche

club in the mid 60s that became the Porsche Club Tucson ... then the Tucson Porsche Club. In the summer of 1967, Gene Parrill, along with fourteen other "Faithful" signed a Charter petition with the Porsche Club of America to become a Region. Obtaining the blessing of the Arizona Region was needed to split Arizona into two Regions. I recall that meeting ... and how we were all so excited to sign the paperwork for the Region.

In January, '67 along with the help of Larry Ashton, I purchased a '55 356 Speedster (for \$800) that my Dad found in Safford over the New Year's holiday. I was anxious to become a part of the Porsche Club and participate in all the various events; this included the popular SCCA slaloms at the old Tucson Airport.


It's amazing to think back that these were just old used sports cars that happened to be German 356 Porsches and were only worth about \$500-\$1000, plus we had a selection to choose from. We simply didn't think anything about their collectability ... except for Larry Randall, who traded his 'A' Coupe for a rare race car: a Carrera Abarth at Vasek Polaks in So. California.

In the next few years, the "SAR Racers" (as we called ourselves), with the security of the PCA National insurance, expanded our horizons and organized the first driver school and auto-x at an abandoned WWII training airstrip behind Picacho Peak. I'm proud to say, as the second SAR President, interest in those 1968-69 events helped launch the club to the next level –the SAR and the Phoenix clubs jointly rented all of Phoenix International Raceway for a weekend of DE track time.

Many people are now surprised to learn that then the PIR track was just a dusty race facility with a configuration that went outside the oval and around Stagecoach hill to complete a 2.75 mile road race course. In fact the experience of those track days prompted a group of us with our relatively new 911's to attend the 1973 Monterey Parade to drive the famed Laguna Raceway speed event.

So many wonderful people have since stepped up to the plate to volunteer their precious time as officers and event chairmen and to perform club duties that has made this club into one of the finest PCA regions on the planet. As your resident old-timer, I couldn't be more proud to say I'm a Charter Member of this Region.


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DE at Arroyo Seco - Feb. 18-19


Please consider joining us at our first Driver Education event for 2017 at Arroyo Seco Raceway (A.K.A. Arroyo Seco Motorplex), located just East of Deming, NM on Saturday, February 18, 2017 to February 19, 2017.

The facility is located about 3-1/2 hours drive from Tucson AZ, via U.S. Highway 10. Although the track has been there for a while, the surface is in good condition. The course itself is very challenging and doubly so because we run in one direction on Saturday and the other on Sunday.

The heart of this event, of course, is the driver education efforts that are extended to SAR and other PCA members and a few participants from other car clubs. All makes and models of automobiles are invited. We have available many instructor-qualified SAR, and Arizona Region members with PCA National Certified Instructor status. The organization of the run groups allows for as many novice, intermediate and advance groups as needed to ensure that a quality experience can be had by all attendees. Our novice (first time drivers) run groups are small and other groups are appropriately sized, depending upon the participation in each group.

Participants attend a drivers meeting with track operations and safety the primary topic. Following that, we have a sit down, indoor chalk talk to lay out the track map, the "line" and a discussion of appropriate driving techniques of each corner. That meeting is followed by parade laps at greatly reduced speeds. This gives the newcomer a chance to assess possible hazards and to become oriented with the course layout, flag and emergency-personnel stations, and the track entry and exit points. The run sessions then begin immediately, with instructors accompanying all novice students. We regularly keep to our set schedule and stay on time. Our sessions are typically 20-minutes long.
