Departure will be promptly at 9 a.m. for the 45 minute trek to the fabulous Kartchner Caverns State Park for a reserved group tour.


DON'T MISS OUT – Tour size is limited to forty entrants (two groups of twenty.)





Sunrise at Inde By Ron Sable

When the alarm went off at 4:30 a.m. in Tucson, I wondered why I had listened to Rink and agreed to be at Inde Motorsports Ranch at 7 a.m. that November morning. He said it was to "take pictures to help him advertise the great PCA-SAR weekend at the track," but as I looked at the outside temperatures, I began to doubt my decision to do just that. It was 44°F in Tucson, dark and calm, and I was leaving a warm bed to do what? To drive the Cayenne to Willcox, and once there, to journey west through hill and dale to Inde, the facility that has generated enormous appeal since it opened in December of 2009 – but then it would have to, because the Willcox Chamber of Commerce website does not exactly get the adrenaline going.

The site says, "Chamber of Commerce and Agriculture" – which should have been my first clue. Willcox is the home of Rex Allen ... and they still celebrate his birthday, even though he died more than 10 years ago. It also is the home of some interestingly named places to stay, if, as they say in Chamber lingo, "you happen to be in the area." They range from the Budget Riteway, to the Cochise Stronghold, the Dancing Crane, the Strawbale Manor, Shady Lane, Sagebrush, and the Hummingbird Ranch House. Fortunately, I was just going for the day, and would get some distance between Willcox and the intended destination – Graham Dorland's private motorsport nirvana – Inde. But I get ahead of myself.

With a Starbucks in hand, the hammer down, and Smokey fast asleep, the trip from north Tucson to Inde resulted in somewhat of a new world landspeed record. If memory serves, the 91 miles was traversed at an average speed in excess (Yes, your honor, it was well in excess) of what would be

considered appropriate. When I arrived, the sun had yet to rise, the outside temperature on the dash read 36°, and the frost was on the pumpkin.

As I entered the track facility, I was met by groves of trees, beautiful and spotless landscape, more garage space and room for parking than you can imagine, as well as the sentinels ... Soviet-era Migs, poised as if ready for takeoff.

The Dorland's 1700 acre ranch near Willcox is surrounded by mountains and numerous elevation changes, and as I pulled into parking, I could hear the Porsches rumbling. Some 30 in number, and their owners and drivers – like ants departing the home base they came – hooded sweats, overcoats, gloves and the rest. If I didn't know better, I would have thought I were in Alaska. But, of course, it was one of the first chilly autumn days in Arizona and the locals thought they had just experienced a major winter blizzard. I surveyed the track from the tower and only then could I appreciate what an amazing facility it is ... 2.75 miles of asphalt with 30 different track configurations ... pristine in the morning sunrise. Finally, it would begin to warm the natives and as they shed their layers, we found real people under all that cotton, wool and Nomex.

The check-in was smooth, the coffee was hot and the pastries were just right. Jim and Kathleen, and Rink and Mickey run a very professional ship ... and on this Sunday at Inde, it was flawless – organized, smooth, timely and simply, a class act. So we completed the assigned task – taking photos of everyone there that day – drivers, fans, tech editors, pinups, instructors, you name it – on and off the track – they are all etched in history.

I even got a chance to drive the track in our 2013 Cayenne, but that is another story for another day. (So before you ask, the Boxster S was in ICU, but is expected to recover.)

Upon reflection, there is only one conclusion to draw. These weekends at Inde are pure pleasure. If you have not been, you are missing a rare treat. Graham Dorland has realized a dream and he and his son CJ have made it available to all of us. What a special place.

Escape to LA By Kathleen and Jim Kendler

On October 22, 2013, two lone Porsches headed out at o-dark-thirty from the parking lot at Beyond Bread on Oracle to begin their Escape to LA. It was a dark morning when a Carrera White 2007 997 Carrera 4 Coupe and a 1994 Guards Red 968 headed towards Pomona, California. Beyond Bread doesn't open until 6:30 a.m. (drats!), but the Safeway was open and provided us a pit stop before the trip. The Southern Arizona Region's excursion party consisted of Jim and Kathleen Kendler and Dave and Pat Shryock.

It was a pleasant, uneventful drive except when we approached Desert Springs. As the hills came into sight, all Kathleen could see was a sea of wind fans littering the countryside. From our perspective, it appeared they were on the road until we drew closer. It was a freaky experience and caused me to sense vertigo while watching all the wind blades turn. Lucky for me, Jim was driving. Fortunately, we did not get the same perspective on the return trip.

The Sheraton Fairplex and L.A. County Fairgrounds were home base for all activities for this event. It is 543 acres of fairgrounds, a horse racing facility, a drag strip known as the Auto Club Raceway at Pomona, and the Wally Parks NHRA Motor Sports Museum, presented by the Automobile Club of Southern California.

We were given a wonderful spiral-bound book that contained the master schedule. Each of the tours had separate tabs which outlined pertinent information about the area of the tour and how to get there from the hotel. What we found interesting was that due to traffic constraints, all but one tour began somewhere other than the hotel. The book was informative. It stated when you should leave the hotel and gave you a realistic window for travel time ... just in case you ran into traffic. The directions on how to get to the start point were very accurate and precise.

Our first tour the next morning was the Gamble House in Pasadena, California. It took Jim and me approximately 75 minutes to go 28 measly miles ... and that was using the HOV lane. A couple that left approximately 30 minutes later made the trip in under an hour. The freeway was a rolling parking lot at about 20-25 miles an hour with lane splitters

everywhere. What are lane splitters? They are motorcyclists that ride down the center between two lanes of traffic. This can be dangerous to them and made Kathleen a little uneasy as they screamed by her passenger window. But overall, the L.A. highway system was nice and efficient.

The Gamble House was designed by Charles Sumner and Mather Greene of the architectural firm Greene and Greene. It definitely has a Japanese flair and was built for David B. Gamble of the Proctor and Gamble Company during the period 1908 to 1909. The house has very limited lighting and dark teak in a lot of the areas. It is a beautiful house with beautiful grounds surrounding it. It was not anything I was expecting to see so near the Rose Bowl.

After the tour, Jim & I walked the surrounding neighborhoods to see other Greene and Greene homes. It was a very pleasant walk and due to the detailed Gamble house tour, we could spot the homes by the architectural style without the tour map. Our docent was very knowledgeable and gave us enough information to make us enlightened but dangerous.

Upon returning from the tour, Jim sought out the crew that was designated to set up the parking lot at the Sheraton into a drive-in. "Bullitt" was the feature. The event coordinators set up a large temporary screen, wireless speakers, and FM transmitters so you could watch from inside your vehicle. Included in this display was a dinner and car show. Magnus Walker was the celebrity judge with categories such as "Most Interesting Display of Bugs on a Windshield." Our 1994 Guards Red 968 was lucky enough to win the Zone-8 Representative's Award presented by Tom Brown at the banquet on Saturday evening.

Our second tour did leave from the hotel. It was a spirited Mulholland Drive excursion. It was composed of five groups at ten minute intervals. By the time we stopped at the Murphy Auto Museum for a catered lunch, Kathleen was green around the gills. At the lunch, we were able to catch up with the Shryocks. The Amans, as well as others from the Arizona Region, were also there.

We then proceeded to the Mullin Automotive Museum. This is an impressive Art Deco museum. The Mullins really like Art Deco furniture and cars. Can you imagine French Art Deco cars made by Bugatti, Voisin, Hispano-Suiza and Delahave? The sweeping lines of the Delahaves are gorgeous. My least favorite was the unrestored cars of the Schlumpf collection ... mainly made up of Bugattis. It is an interesting concept to keep these cars original. Jim wants to revisit this museum with other friends in the future. He would also like to be a docent there. Not an easy task ... they require resumes ... conduct interviews, and then you might be selected. But I understand the perks are GREAT! After you have been around awhile, you might be selected to represent Mr. & Mrs. Mullins at a concours event with one of their cars. What a trip, you'd get to drive the cars!

On Sunday, after we stopped at the driving event on the Fairplex grounds, we visited the Huntington Library. "Huntington Library" is a misnomer. It is a library, a botanical garden, and a museum of art located on over 120 acres of countryside. The gardens are wonderful. We thoroughly enjoyed the desert gardens and the rose gardens. They are many more. The library is not completely open to the public; there is a substantial space for serious researchers which is not open to the mere tourist.



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
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
