



#### FIRST ONE

#### By Don Angell

INDE ... gets me excited just thinking about it ... and those in the know ... know that I don't get excited easily!!

Jan Ramaker convinced me to take my first trip to INDE in November 2011. He had primed me with his own personal stories about his past track event experiences. Jan made me understand that the INDE event was an ultra-safe driving event – and one of the newest and best tracks around. So off we went on Friday afternoon, 11/19/2011 ... heading for Willcox, AZ. Jan was in the lead in his always-shiny blue 356 Porsche Coupe. I followed in my Speed Yellow 2008 C4S with apprehension beginning to settle in ... thinking, "What on earth was I getting into now?!"

It was a short drive to Willcox. We took the first Willcox exit and then headed north to the INDE track to get our cars inspected. We passed the inspection, picked up our registration materials, and then took a look around. WOW! What a nice facility. It was clearly evident that the owner of this track spent a great deal of time and money securing this secluded property... and then proceeded to build one of the best highly technical tracks around and surround it with tastefully done landscaping and first class buildings for storage, maintenance, track viewing, meeting rooms and restrooms ... and enough paved parking for hundreds of Porsches! It even has a small aircraft runway built into the 2200 foot track straightaway – how neat is that?

We did not have a lot of time to look around because we had to go back to Willcox, check in at the Holiday Inn Express and then head off to Tex's BBQ to meet up with the rest of the folks who were signed up to run the track over the weekend. SAR had made reservations at Tex's BBQ ... which was good because the place was packed. I had good BBQ food, a tall cool one and enjoyable car talk with other excited track enthusiasts. Then back to the hotel for some R & R to prepare for a pre-dawn "rise and shine" call. Getting up this early never did get me excited ... but on that morning I actually awoke unassisted earlier than 5 a.m. I was actually up at 4:30 a.m. ... ready for my first day at the track!

I met Jan for breakfast at 6 a.m. and we were at the

track by 7. I thought we would be the first ones there – but not true. Tech inspection was already open and operational with several cars lined up waiting their turn. I noted that all were not Porsches but did not dwell too long on that because we had to offload everything from the inside of our cars before we could go on the track. As we were completing this task, the huge parking lot (learned later it is called the Paddock) was rapidly filling up with more cars and SUVs, pick-ups, heavy haulers, motor homes – all hauling fast looking track cars. I am thinking ... "These guys are really serious" ... and apprehension settles in once more.

By about 7:20 a.m., Jan and I were in line to take "tour laps" ... laps taken by small group, led by an instructor to tour the track a few times at moderate speeds for track familiarization. I kept thinking, "This is going to be a blast!" With tour laps completed, we attended the mandatory drivers meeting where we received safety instructions, passing instructions and some preliminaries on how to drive the line. We then were introduced to our instructor for the day who asked what we wanted to work on? After I fumbled around for a response, the instructor said, "Not to worry ... we will cover that later." Before our first run, new drivers (definitely me) had to attend a classroom session that described the layout of the track in more detail, how to approach and make each turn and more about safety aspects.

OK, I am ready to drive!!! Because I was a rookie, I was assigned to the Novice Group. With my instructor at my side, we safely navigated two morning run sessions at 20 minutes each. I am thinking I need more class time ... too many things I am doing wrong and I cannot remember all that was discussed in the morning classes. A catered lunch gave Jan and me some time to compare notes ... and it gave me some time to settle down. By the time lunch was over, I was ready to try the track again. Each of the three afternoon runs, with superb coaching by my instructor, was better than the last ... and though I was tired, I was feeling really good ... and had a broad smile on my face. The parting words from the instructor were, "Don't worry. You are doing well ... more 'seat time' will make a big difference!!"


Before Jan and I exchanged stories of the day over a cocktail, I had called Pat (my wife) and she could tell by the excitement in my voice that I was hooked. And she was right. After a couple more cocktails, Jan explained what "seat time" was – and since then, I have attended every available day at INDE. Now my INDE "Seat time" days total six ... six glorious, thrilling, fun-filled "seat time" days.

The drive home seemed longer, but it gave me a lot of time to think. I was thinking ... how could I convert my 1997 Porsche Boxster into a track-specific car? By the time I arrived home, I had it all figured out. Pat met me at the door Sunday afternoon and we spent the rest of Sunday talking about my weekend, which eventually

got around to my track-specific car idea. Pat listened and then asked, "What do you need to do to make the Boxster track-specific...and what will it cost?" I explained what my thoughts were and said it could amount to about \$50K ... and she said, "Well, you would be better off with a new Porsche." I said, "Wow, I never thought of *that* idea!" One year later, we had a new Guards Red 2013 Boxster S in our garage as a running mate to our Speed Yellow 2008 911 C4S.

To make things even better, I convinced Pat to join me at INDE ... which she has for the last five trips. Now I need to work on getting her on the track!!!

When is our next trip to INDE? November 15 and 16, 2014. See you all at the track!!



#### Cars 'n Troops By Ron Sable

It didn't start out that way. Our idea, born some seven years ago at a Porsche Club meeting, was to enhance the annual DM 50 Picnic for the young enlisted families at Davis Monthan Air Force Base (DM).

As a DM 50 Board member and Chairman of the show, I was hopeful that we could encourage the PCA-Southern Arizona Region to support us in putting on a Casual Classic Car Show in conjunction with the Picnic, and in the process contribute to the Kachina Fund – the 501 c) 3) established to help young military families in need (and there are lots of them) at DM. Participants would submit an entry fee and that would go to the Kachina Fund. Part of the entering argument was that we "would not pay for anything." While that may have been idealistic, in reality, during the six years of the show, less than 1% of what we have taken in has gone towards expenses (some things just *have* to be paid for).

The show has grown over the years from the first round of 42 cars to this year's 126 registrants. 122 cars actually made it to the show, including everything from an Audi A8, to a 911 GT3, Ferraris, Maseratis, a host of XKEs, Mercedes, Corvettes, Aston Martins, 40 Fords, and a Velocette (look it up). Our Porsche Club had 29

registered cars but ended up with 26 on the field. The Tucson British Car Club was hot on our heels with 22 cars.

We have a military category, and only allow enlisted folks to vote for their favorites in all categories. For the \$40 entry fee, we provide lunch for the driver and one passenger, and we also give every entrant a DM50 coin. Trophies (A-10 Cannon Shells, polished and engraved) are presented in eight categories, and this year we had over 2,000 visit the car show and vote for their winners.

Going forward, we know that the physical limitation of the soccer field where we hold the show is somewhere around 130 cars ... but that also keeps the show more personal. Lest I forget, Jim Kendler, Randy Hannon and Lee Cuevas have been champions for SAR participation and we could not have done it without them. In the process, we have evolved to raising over \$6,000 this year, and again, it all goes to the Kachina Fund.

The DM 50 values the PCA-SAR membership support highly, and looks forward to another "Sold Out" year in 2015. Who knows, maybe one day it will become the Annual Casual Classic Car Show enhanced by a picnic.

#### **Hike & Drive**

On Saturday, April 5, 2014, a few Porsches and their passengers met at the intersection of Highway 83 and Sahuarita Road. From that location, we traveled into Patagonia. Soon we arrived at the Paton House located behind the main street. The Paton House is primarily known for its birds. I was able to watch vermilion, cardinals, woodpeckers, wrens and hummingbirds. Other people with rather large lenses on their cameras, were looking for the gray hawk and other rare birds. After some time at Paton House, all of us, including the Sierra Vista contingent, headed toward the Preserve.

We drove about a mile on a dirt road to arrive at the Nature Conservancy's Patagonia-Sonoita Creek Preserve. There we were met by a docent who pointed out some of the birds and told us about the watercress growing in the Sonoita Creek. I learned that the word cienega means wetlands ... a marshy area. The docent also showed us the differences in three types of hummingbirds,

Andrea kept us on track as I led the hike. We took the Railway Trail and were able to hear some birds. Scat and cow patties could be seen along the trail and in the meadows. It was nice to have shade, greenery, and a cool breeze. As we finished our hike, some of us

decided we would take the Family Trail. This area is the Preserve's project for reintroducing native grasses into the area. We learned that when conditions get too dry, the hummingbirds will abandon their nests and young as they go into survival mode. I guess it's necessary but seems a bit harsh to me. Lunch at the Stage Stop Inn in Patagonia completed our afternoon.

Thanks to our tour planner Kurt Fuerstenau for coordinating yet another wonderful outing. We hope he is recovering well from hip surgery and that he will be able to join us on the next hike.

If you haven't attended one of these, you are missing out on great company, views and scenery. If you like bird watching, these hikes are for you. If you want to learn more about birds, join Kurt and his band of merry hikers on these excursions.



Our 356 A shines on a clear day near the slopes






