While I was stationed in Germany, I drove Ferraris, BMWs and a Porsche 928. I was feeling the need for speed. Fate jumped in when I was getting ready to make the jump to the BMW 525. My wife told me she was pregnant. So my BMW turned into a 1986 Volkswagen Vanagon. So in September, 1986, I arrived in Tucson with my Vanagon, my wife, and three kids.

Okay, where am I going with this? It is now 60 years since Bill Sholar started PCA ... and here I am a PCA member. The influence of the people and of this organization in my life, are now inseparable. I have owned Porsches, I have enjoyed club events, I have been in office, and I will continue doing so. Why? Because it is so much fun.



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Cinco's Zone 8 Autocross at Musselman Honda Circuit Apology from Jim Kendler – SAR Past President

This year's annual PCA-SAR Cinco celebration started on Sunday, April 26 at the Musselman Honda Circuit. The Mussleman Circuit is the only track venue that PCA-SAR uses that is in the Tucson city area. All other current driving venues are outside of Pima County. Over the years, the track owner and manager has made improvements to enhance the autocross experience for car clubs using its Kart Track for automobile events. His last improvement project increased the length of the track, added a huge skid pad, and provided a large entry/exit gate for your favorite sports car.

This year, we had our largest Cinco attendance ever for this venue – thirty-two drivers signed up to enjoy this very challenging and technical track. All attendees were assigned to a run group by skill level and received three 20 minute continuous lapping practice sessions. PCA-SAR calls this type of driving event an autocross - driver education style. In a normal (PCA or SCCA) autocross session, the driver usually gets three one or two minute practice sessions. All of our participants received 60 minutes of high speed fun with their favorite sports car ... compared to six to eight minutes of track time at a normal autocross.

The times of the drivers who were able to complete their runs

PCA-SAR *usually* runs timing at the end of the last practice session. Unfortunately, that didn't happen this year. I must apologize to all participants who did not receive their timed runs. If you did not hear, my new- to- me 1958 Porsche 356 engine died at the end of my first timed lap ... dropping oil on half of the track on the driving line.

The oil made the track unsafe for rest of the participants to receive their timed runs. The details of the 356 engine failure will be the subject of




Now we just need to get those twelve cars from the parking lot onto the lawn!



Amerind Museum and Art Gallery Tour By Jerry Fouts – PCA-SAR Member

PCA –SAR concluded our Cinco de Mayo 2015 celebration with a spectacular and very informative event coordinated by Dave Shryock and his wife, Pat. We toured the Amerind Museum and Art Gallery in Dragoon, AZ and finished it off with a great lunch at the Rock Saloon and Triangle T Guest Ranch.

Our tours were given by Dr. Christine Szuter, Executive Director and Dr. Eric Kaldahl, Chief Curator and Deputy Director of the Amerind Foundation. We all enjoyed their presentations and learned a lot about the Foundation and the ancient Native American Indians.

The Amerind Foundation was established in 1937 by William S. Fulton. In case you are wondering, "Amerind" is a contracted form of "American Indian" and was a widely used term in the early 20th century. The foundation is a nonprofit research institution for the study and preservation of early Native American cultures. Amerind houses one of the finest collections of prehistoric objects from archaeological excavations in the United States.

Fulton first came to the west from his home in Connecticut to visit the Grand Canyon in 1906. He was so fascinated by the Southwest and its peoples and history that he returned many times developing an "intimate concern" for Arizona and the diversity of the physical and cultural environment. Fulton eventually built a home in the Texas Canyon in 1931. He created the Foundation to fully dedicate his research into America's historic past. Mr. Fulton directed the Foundation until his death in 1964, and now his survivors remain on the board to continue the research and study.

After the Foundation tour, we caravanned to the Rock Saloon and Triangle T Guest Ranch for a wonderful lunch. Before lunch, we were treated to the history of the Rock Saloon and the guest ranch by owners Linda Kelly and Don Beesley. The ranch was used as a movie setting for many famous movies, including the 1957 3:10 to Yuma starring Glenn Ford and Van Heflin. One of the buildings used is still there and provided a great backdrop for a photo op. The ranch has been visited by many movie stars such as John Wayne, Glenn Ford, Kix Brooks (of Brooks and Dunn Fame), and many others. The guest ranch was also used as an internment facility for high-ranking Japanese dignitaries during World War II. There was little security and there were no escape attempts.

Our hats off and kudos to Dave and Pat Shryock for a wonderful and informative day. The tour and lunch was enjoyed by all and the weather was absolutely perfect. Thanks Dave. Great finish to our Cinco de Mayo celebrations!

Third Place: Jim Kendler with 239.3 points


