



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

### **Rennsport Reunion**

For the second time in a row, the PCNA gathering known as Rennsport, was held at Laguna Seca Raceway outside of Monterey, CA, (you may note that I did not mention the Laguna Seca main sponsor ... that is because none of us would want to hear a word about Mazda.)

Even more than four years ago, the gathering of the faithful was so well done ... right down to the parade laps around the track that were scheduled for 1:05 p.m. daily. After staging some 80 Porsches around the track, the green flag dropped at ... you guessed it ... 1:05 p.m. for us (Brother Hannon and myself), with me as the official photographer, and Randy as the driver. (It was only fair, of course, because I drove my Boxster on the course four years ago.)

According to Zone 8, there were over 1400 Porsche owners at this 2015 event – up from more than 800 in 2011. This year, there was a total attendance of more than 57,000 with over 800 cars. There were more than 60 historic cars – most from the Porsche Museum in Stuttgart – to say nothing of the many race cars some attendees brought ... or the new 911s that Porsche unveiled. My favorite was a new Carrera 4S in GT Silver with a Cognac interior -- one beautiful car -- at only \$146,000.

We did a "road trip" to end all road trips – 806.5 miles from Tucson to Laguna Seca (reasonable prices), Monterey (pricey food) and Salinas (cheaper rooms). According to Google, that should take about "12 hours and 23 minutes," but I can tell you from experience, that it can safely be done in about 11 hours -- you just need to plan for one to pump the gas and the passenger to get the lunch and watch for CHIPS. Breaking up the pit stop as we did, reduced our pit stop times dramatically.

The roads, particularly around L.A., are disastrous -even some of the newly paved ones. You either have a loose kidney, or you will have after several hours on the L.A. washboards. After that, Arizona roads don't look bad at all.

There were over 320 race cars and more than 20 races, including the GT3 Cup Challenge Championship. Every day at the track was filled with racing in the various classes – everything from Cayman GT4s, to LongTails, GT3s, to GTS Club

Coupes, with 904s and 917s in abundance --- but nothing prepared us for the 919. We were in the 919 garage when the team decided to change all four tires - that lasted about five seconds - and then it was on the track. It made every other car there look like it was old fashioned when it came to performance. Even the thirteen 918s there (one in lime green) took a back seat to the 919. Patrick Dempsey was there with his team, as was Hurley Haywood and the Brumos crowd, and Patrick Long. Other attendees included Derek Bell, (5 LeMans victories), Vic Elford, Jacky Ickx, Jochen Mass, Brian Redmond, Danny Sullivan, and Hans Stuck.

We spotted several SAR members there but were only able to connect with Rick Barrett, who we ran into on Saturday morning. I'm hoping he will again have his Rennsport slide show for a future club meeting. With 57,000 folks in attendance and all on the go, we were lucky to see anyone we recognized.

One of the great sessions for us was the chance to spend a half hour of uninterrupted time with Magnus Walker, the L.A. Porsche genius. He was delightful ... and if we had not moved on to the garages and other venues. I think he would still be talking to us ... sharing his experiences, describing his many projects underway, and just being a great fan of Porsches.

There may be better tracks than Laguna Seca. though I can't think of any. I can say with high confidence that the folks at PCNA put on one great event this year one that created a ton of memories and gave us a chance to get up close and personal with the 919. Can it get any better than that? For a summary of the event, check mazdaraceway.com and scroll down to the "Rennsport V – A Return to Monterey" video. It will be worth your time.







### Oktoberfest 2015 By Barb Crowley – Social Chair


