






SAR Zone 8 Concours and Judges School By Peter Beahan – Concours Judging Liaison

On October 4, the Southern Arizona Region and the Arizona Region (AZR) held a Concours and Judges School. The school followed the Zone 8 rules and qualified for meeting the requirements for becoming or advancing as a judge in Zone 8.

The school was attended by 21 members of PCA from SAR and AZR, and we were happy of have Zone 8 Representative, Tom Brown, join us from San Diego. After a last minute change of location, we started with an overview of the concours rules and the criteria that Zone 8 has spelled out for judging the Porsches that participants enter in a concours.

Ken Hollett made a presentation on judging the exterior of the car and Jim Kendler instructed regarding how to judge the interior of the car. I covered the storage and engine compartments of the car and Jack Aman from the AZR, discussed judging the undercarriage of the car.

Our judges all contributed and exchanged ideas regarding how they judge the vehicles that will lead to more consistent judging in both regions. Tom Brown stated that he was happy with our emphasis on making the judging process a positive and fun experience for all concours entrants. Tom also updated us regarding activities that are taking place in Zone 8.

The judges school is a good opportunity for all members to learn about participating in a concours, whether you are thinking of becoming a judge or not. You can learn about cleaning your vehicle and what areas the judges will be inspecting. If you have an interest in showing your car, plan on attending the next judges school.



DY356D By Bob Strickler

Introduction by Barb Crowley: DY356D stands for "Drive Your 356 Day." This is not just a local event, it takes place all over the <u>world</u>! It took place on September 21 in Tucson with six 356s from SAR. SAR Charter and Lifetime member, Jeff Gamble, shared the following trivia/history about the origins of this event:

Many years ago, Dick Douglas posted this message on the old 356 Talk ... "Wouldn't it be nice if all of us drove our 356s on one day?" Within minutes, I responded, posting a suggestion that a good day to have this drive would be on Ferry Porsche's birthday on September 19. And so it came to be that DY356D would be held September 19 ... or the closest Sunday to his actual birthday. (In the 356 Registry magazine coverage of the 2009 356 West Coast Holiday in Sedona, there is a very nice photo of Dick and me recognizing us as co-founders of this annual 356 event honoring Ferry Porsche.)

Gordon Maltby, Editor of the *356 Registry* magazine, has been

instrumental in perpetuating this event by requesting 356 owners to submit DY356D photos to him. He publishes dozens of the photos in a special issue. The photos that aren't chosen are made available online. Gordon received "several hundred" submissions within 24 hours of the event!

And so, it appears, this all began with one of our own. Thanks, Jeff. I have been interested in getting more local 356 cars on the road and out to events, which is what inspired my organizing this little tour on this most holy of days. According to Tom Sherman, we have 26 SAR members who own 32 356s of one sort or another. Wow! Then there are unknown numbers of 356 owners in the area who are not SAR members. That is a lot of cars whose youngest is now approaching 50 years old.

The preservation of these cars is a real testimony to the uniqueness and quality of Ferry Porsche's dream. Truly the grandfather of our modern Porsches, the first 356 prototype was built in 1948. Production of the 356 ran until 1965 with the 912 and 911 following. Hints of this early design are still seen in current production cars. Just look at their noses when you see a line of Porsches of varying years. Certainly the concept of a pleasant-driving nimble car lives on to this day. But I digress.

The tour was as much designed to get good photo ops for the *Registry* magazine as it was to get out and about. Fun sporty driving was not to be the high point ... but good scenery was. We took off north and then around through the Picture Rocks area, Saguaro National Park, Tucson Regional Mountain Park, through the McCain Loop Road, and over Gates Pass

Road. All wonderfully winding, hilly, dipping roads – "Porsche roads." Recent rains had the desert dressed up in its very best green and a lot of flowers were still out to punctuate the roadsides. The clouds even came out to give some contrast to a very blue sky. This loop is certainly one of the most scenic in the Tucson area. We are lucky to have it. A thank you to all of those who worked hard to preserve this wonderful area.

We had lots of photo stops. Garry Morris was kind enough to shadow us and take photos. Garry actually owns a pretty black 356, however her wheels were in California being restored (excuses!). But he came along anyway in his bright red Acura. Barbara Crowley also took some good photos that are shown in this *ZN* on our SAR website, and on the 356 Registry website.

The tour began with a Mexican brunch at Theresa's Mozaic Cafe on the west side. Six 356 cars showed up with nine folks on board. Jim and Kathleen Kendler joined us for brunch and drove along for a bit taking some photos. Pete Jacoby and his wife Cheryl also stopped by for a visit.

Present for the tour were Jeff Gamble and Patsy Conklin in a bright 1960 Aetna Blue Roadster, Dennis and Barbara Crowley driving their 1953 Creme Coupe, Steve Proctor in his recently restored1958 Ruby Red Speedster, Jack and Nancy Allen brought a pretty1965 Togo Brown Coupe, Jan Ramaker drove his1964 Sky Blue Coupe, and I drove my 1953 Radium Green Cabriolet. What needs to be appreciated here is the uniqueness, condition, and variety of these cars. A Speedster, a Cabriolet, two Coupes, a Roadster, and two Pre-A cars – a very remarkable representation of the early Porsche stable.

All participants were very good sports contending with frequent stops and rather warm conditions (356 cars are famous for their two-hole-crank-down air conditioning systems). We all got a good breakfast, good photos, and good memories. Oh yes, and a lot of staring and thumbs-ups from passing motorists! It is nice to share these cars.



Oktoberfest Beer Tasting By Ken Hollett – Oktoberfest Beer Meister

A couple of weeks before the Oktoberfest party, I went shopping at BevMo Liquors at Wilmot and Broadway. There I found many interesting beers and managed to select six British Commonwealth ales for our tasting. The six selected ales all seemed to support the concept of a successful beer tasting. The day before the party, I wrapped aluminum foil around the bottles and numbered each of them. There were a total of 35 bottles, just enough for a 2.5 ounce sip of each beer for everyone. The purpose of the foil was to hide the identity so each beer could be tasted and evaluated on its merits. The number on the foil-covered cap and bottle represented the tasting order so the servers could produce them in the order that matched the evaluation form. On the afternoon of the party, Claudia and I headed west to the quest house of Peter and Fran Stach to set up at 3:30 p.m. for a 4:00 p.m. party start.

Below are the British Commonwealth ales by country in the order we tasted them. The numbers in boldhighlighted brackets are the average scores tabulated for each beer. The beers are summarized below the name.

<u>1 – Newcastle Brown Ale (Great Britain)</u> **[23.6]** – A blood red ale with a sweet berry overtone and a hint of bitterness.

<u>2 – Belhaven Scottish Ale (Scotland)</u> [22.0] – A brown thick beige head with lots of malt without being sweet and with a balanced and toasty finish.

<u>3 – Fuller's ESB (Great Britain)</u> **[21.5]** – Liquid English legend and most awarded British beer. A full body ale with malt and rich hoppiness, which develops into a rich fruity finish.

<u>4 – Unibroue Maudite Amber Red Ale on Lee (Canada)</u> [23.4] – Known as "The Damned." Toasty caramel infused with undertones of sherry or port, which is incredibly rich and smooth.

5 -Smithwick's Premium Irish Ale (Ireland) **[23.5]** - Taste of ale and lager that is creamy and smooth with a rich hop finish.

<u>6 – Steinlager (New Zealand)</u> **[21.4]** – A lager bordering on being an ale with a pleasant hop aroma and great balance.

Each beer was evaluated using the criteria of: body, foam, color, aroma, taste, bitterness and flavor. Each item could be assigned a "score" of 0-5 points so that a total of 35 points would describe an outstanding beer at least in the mind of the person evaluating it. The lowest score was for the Steinlager (6) (New Zealand) with a score of 21.4 and the highest was the Newcastle Brown Ale (Great Britain) with a score of 23.6. The top three ales were within a few tenths of a point and the two lowest scored ales were also just a few tenths apart. The results were based on 11 tasters who completed their tasting forms and an additional one taster who only completed part of the form. I disregarded the incomplete form, but noticed that even the completed part mimicked the final results. I estimated that another 10 people tasted the beers but did not complete a form; however, everyone who partook of the six beers indicated that they enjoyed the selection and range of tastes.

One last word, if you have difficulty finding these beers at your favorite market, I suggest you drop by BevMo Liquors and have a look at their imported beer section. You will be amazed by the variety of other imported and domestic beers. As an added benefit, you can buy a single beer or make up a six pack of your choice. If you already have favorites, ask one of the knowledgeable staff for those beers and hold your own private tasting. What a great way to educate your taste buds. And ... don't forget to do this seasonally; there are different beers for different seasons!

The beer tasting was a small part of a wonderful event, which included a fall evening in Tucson with great people. Many thanks to Peter and Fran Stach for again hosting our SAR Oktoberfest party. An additional thank you goes to Dave and Pat Shryock for organizing this

year's event. And how about those brats? Larry Rogovein did a great job grilling them! Approximately sixty people were in attendance ... no one went home hungry ... or thirsty!






