#### Announcement Change in Membership Year



These weren't your run of the mill carved pumpkins ... they were awardwinning sculptures.

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# Photographing a 1955 Speedster

A little over a year ago, Ben Sherman from Silver City, New Mexico asked his old friend Chuck Croteau about repainting his 1955 356 Pre-A Speedster. Now it is finished and ready to be auctioned off at the 2016 Gooding and Company Scottsdale Auctions being held on Friday and Saturday, January 29–30.

The story goes that Ben and his son bought the car in the early 1990s as a restoration project. They have a numbers-matching car and have kept it Kardex accurate. By 1995, they had rebuilt the engine, transmission, brakes and suspension. The car came with a factory 'high bow top' and they bought a remanufactured "low bow top" along with side windows. The interior carpets were redone. The door panels and the seats were recovered correctly. This 1500 cc Speedster has period-correct 16 inch rims and new Michelin tires ... a rare, Pre-A, round Hazet tool kit clamps onto the spare tire. Then the son went off to college and the car remained in the garage.

Then Chuck brought the Speedster here to Tucson and took control of the restoration. Several thick layers of paint were stripped down to the bare metal. No rust was found, but a few areas of damage needed to be leaded in by Fred Baron from the old car division of Truly Nolan Exterminators. Teardrop tail lights were removed and restored to four original "beehives." All bolts and nuts were replaced as original before undercoating was applied. The VDO gauges were redone by North Hollywood Speedometer.

The final step of this outstanding restoration was the correct, gleaming, white paint applied by K and K Kustom Painting. Chuck Croteau says this is the finest example of an original Pre-A Speedster that he has worked with in over 40 years of service and restoration.

All of the major auto auctions produce catalogs showing the automobiles to be placed on the auction block. The catalogs feature each car with a first class photograph and a detailed description. Printed on heavy stock paper with excellent color reproduction, they are worthy of any fine art gallery.

When Chuck told me the photographer from Gooding and Company was coming, I asked to tag along. Mike Maez turned out to be a very friendly and interesting person. He had just driven in from his last car shoot in Wichita, Kansas.

Mike has photographed professionally for 15 years and worked for Gooding the last four years. He is based in Anaheim Hills, CA. He and two others do the majority of the catalogs, along with a few freelancers. What sounds like a fun job can be quite involved. He typically shoots more than 30 cars across the country prior to each of the three or four auctions each year. Mike told me the following story that shows his dedication to his work:

"I was scheduled to shoot an original 1964 Shelby Cobra in St. Paul, MN in 2013 ... and it just so happened that a late winter storm hit unexpectedly and snowed us in. That night I had some intense stomach pain and decided to drive myself to the ER as it was very bad. It turns out I had appendicitis and had to have an emergency appendectomy. Needless to say, I was in touch with the owner of the car who was understanding in postponing the shoot and even came to visit me in the hospital. I checked out of the hospital two days later and with the help of the car owner, I still managed to get the shoot done, fresh from surgery. The car later sold at Pebble Beach for north of \$800,000 and I'm proud to say I've never missed a Gooding and Co. shoot."

Mike started photographing the Speedster with detailed views of the underside of the car, the engine compartment, the spare tire, the opened tool container, and of course close-ups of the interior.

Then he asked if we knew of a special place to take the main image for the catalog. The lighting and the background are very important to show the car in an appealing pose.

Mike and I drove around the area of Alvernon and River Road looking for a place with a view of the Santa Catalina Mountains. After about 30 minutes of poking around here and there, we found the perfect spot. It is a open desert area with a sahuaro and no visible buildings. Impressive stormy clouds were hovering above the mountaintops. The location is a photographer's secret.

Mike took multiple handheld shots. Front, back, side view, low to show light underneath, top up, top down and, of course, the standard three quarters front view that will be in the catalog.

It was a real pleasure to shoot alongside Mike Maez, a true and dedicated automobile photographer. You can always learn a few more tricks of the trade.

It is expected to be sold for between \$300,000 and \$400,000.

West. There we will be treated to a private, guided tour of the facility. Finally, the back road home.


