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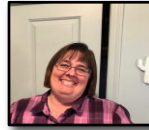
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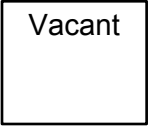
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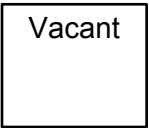
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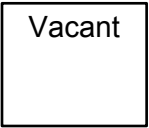
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President's Message

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Speed Bump - Slow Down for Some Automotive Tales

I suppose I should have a St. Christopher medallion hanging from my rearview mirror as many people do. But I don't. I just never thought I needed it. In retrospect, maybe I do.

It is said that a small child asked him to carry him across a dangerous river. St. Christopher obliged, but as he entered midstream, the river rose and the child's weight grew and he became extremely heavy. With great exertion, St. Christopher safely delivered the child to the other side. When St. Christopher asked the child why he was so heavy, the child explained that He was the Christ child, and when St. Christopher carried Him, he also carried the weight of the whole world on his shoulders. The child then vanished.

The concept of a guardian angel can be found in many ancient theologies, including Jewish, Christian, and Islamic religions. They can guide and protect a person, group, or country. Some believe that a personal angel is assigned to everyone at birth. According to Wikipedia: Saint Thomas of Aquinas, an Italian monk in the 13th century, said, "On this road, man is threatened by many dangers ... and therefore, as guardians are appointed to men who have to pass by an unsafe road, an angel is assigned to each man as long as he is a wayfarer."

Looking back over several decades, I think I am either very lucky when I drive my car or I have St. Christopher or a Guardian Angel looking over my shoulder.

About 40 years ago, my two teenage sons and I were fishing in the White Mountains. We had our gear in our trustworthy 1960s Toyota FJ40 Land Cruiser when we decided to take a shortcut to the next lake. We were about three miles along a faint forest trail over the mountain when a tire blew out. No problem. The guys had the spare put on in no time at all. About 10 minutes later along that rocky road there was a big problem. BAM!! Another tire bit the dust – so to speak. Now what? This was well before cell phones and no one

knew where we were. As we sat there pondering our fate, over the crest of the hill came a Chevy pickup. The forester said, "What are you guys doing here?"



When he saw *Our venerable Toyota FJ40 that had many off road adventures.* our problem he said, "My spare won't fit your Toyota but see if this old wheel I have in back will work." That must have been when the Guardian Angel smiled because it was inflated and a perfect fit. We followed him out and decided it was time for a beer or two or three.

About 30 years ago, I had the two guys out camping. We were driving our Ford Expedition along with a friend in his Nissan 4WD. We had been camping and hiking off the beaten path in Bloody Basin half way between Camp Verde and Cave Creek north of Phoenix. We were going home on a rough dirt road close to the Verde River when the Nissan suddenly stopped. We had to leave it there when we couldn't get it going again. So those three people and all of their camping gear were stuffed into the Ford along with our gear. About an hour later we had a pit stop. When I turned the key on to start, there was this sickening RRR RRR RRR sound of a dead battery. It was getting dark and we were at least 20 miles from Cave Creek. Now what? At least we had our camping gear and some leftover snacks. This time the Angel sent a cowboy in his pickup ... and that cowboy had jumper cables. We were only two hours late in reaching civilization again.

It is now February 2017. I had been bugging my friend Paul Duffey about going back to visit the Total Wreck Mine on the remote east side of the Empire Mountains. We had been there several times over the past 20 years. I remembered

the trail as being fairly flat and that I could make the trip with my All Wheel Drive Honda CRV. So we rounded up two friends, Joe and Bob, who would go in Bob's 2004 Ford F150 pickup. We were about five miles south of the I-10 turnoff, east of the mountain range. The trail was becoming more rocky when we heard, 'RUMBLE RUMBLE RUMBLE,' the sound of the left front tire going flat. It took some time to get a flat rock in place so we could use the jack. Suddenly, Bob fell to the ground. His right ankle was at an awkward angle. As he lay on a fairly smooth area, I determined he had fractured his ankle badly. (It turned out to be a tri-malleolar fracture – the worst kind, requiring surgery). I found a large roll of silver duct tape in the back of his pickup. I just duct taped his high-topped hiking boot in place until there was no movement. That made Bob much more comfortable. He said his pain was a 3 on a scale of 10.

None of our cell phones had any signal so we couldn't call for help for Bob. It was back to changing the tire. The lug nuts came off OK but the wheel would not come loose in spite of tugging, pulling, and twisting. Now what? We considered leaving the Honda and all returning in the pickup ... but would Bob have to lie in the bed of the truck as we bounced around? Just then, HALLELUYA, our Guardian Angels appeared, coming through the creosote bushes as an angel might appear through the clouds. A white Jeep Cherokee pulled up with Dean Lippert and his wife, Laurie. It was archery season and they were out in their favorite area looking for javelinias.

Even with Dean's help we couldn't get the wheel loose. But Laurie had cell phone reception with Verizon. I dug out papers from the glove compartment that had the number for Chapman Honda. We called the service department and asked the

On one stretch, Dean walked ahead of us throwing sharp rocks out of the way to protect our flimsy spare. Bob was able to stretch out enough as a passenger in his pickup to be fairly comfortable. By this time it was late afternoon. As the sun descended in the west, Dean followed us to Tucson. Joe and Bob headed to the hospital. Paul and I headed to Discount Tire. Our Guardian Angels, Dean and Laurie headed off into the sunset.
