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



Legends of Speed

First, I want to say thankyou to all twenty-two participants for a safe and fun tour. Next, I want to say thank-you to my wife Kathleen and our President Pat Norris for volunteering to assist on this tour.

We all started our tour at

the IHOP on Ina Road to sign the PCA waiver and get our required safety brief. The morning was cold for Tucson but great for Hot Air Balloons. The tour group could see Balloons in the Tucson Western sky and over the Western skies over Casa Grande on very our efficient and spirited drive to Phoenix.

The group arrived early allowing participants to talk to each other and wander around some of the Art Museum outside sculptures. If you have not visited the Herd Museum and the Phoenix Art Museum, I would highly recommend it. The museums are just a couple of blocks from each other and the grounds are green with flowers this time of year.

Just before the museum opened, we met our docent John. As you may know, Legends of Speed is the first major exhibition of racing cars presented at Phoenix Art



Museum. Opening in fall 2019 and featuring more than 20 legendary cars by Maserati, Mercedes, Alfa Romeo, Ford, and more, the landmark exhibition showcases an unprecedented collection of cars driven by some of the greatest drivers in the history of racing, including A.J. Foyt, Dan Gurney, and



Stirling Moss. John spent an hour and half giving us the history of his favorite race cars in the collection as we walked around. There was plenty of time for pictures and questions. John was a true racing enthusiast and we were extremely lucky to have him as our docent.

After the guided tour, we had lunch in the Museum Pallet Café. The staff of the Café did



an excellent job allowing all participants to order off the menu and we completed lunch around 1 PM. The tour officially ended after lunch.



Some participants headed directly home after lunch and others went back to look at the car display at their own pace, others viewed the art galleries, and some of us attended the afternoon Museum presentation by Lyn St. James. She competed in

the IndyCar series, with eleven CART and five Indy Racing League starts to her name. St. James is one of nine women who have qualified for the Indianapolis 500, and became the first woman to win the Indianapolis 500 Rookie of the Year award in 1992. She lives in the Phoenix area and was part of the Museum committee that planned and coordinated the

Legends of Speed display. Kathleen and I thoroughly enjoyed her historical talk and slide show about her racing career – very inspirational.

I hope to see you on a future PCA-SAR Tour.



Porsche Parade 101

The 2020 Porsche Parade is close to home, just a few hours away in Palm Springs , CA. Perhaps you read the Parade Preview article in the December 2019 issue of *Panorama* and are considering attending but have some questions. Hopefully, this article will help a Newbie negotiate their first parade.

A few hints -(1) If possible, we have found staying at the host hotel is best for convenience to

the various activities going on during Parade. Besides, it's a great way to meet other Parade goers from other regions and who knows may someday be on your list of best friends. (2) Pace yourself and try not to overload by doing too much during this one week. (3) Check the bulletin board generally found near the Hospitality Room for posted notices from other Parade goers. Also this board posts results from the competitive events and any protests. This is also the "Communication" board among Parade goers. (4) Register for Phase 2 early. Don't delay, especially if you are interested in doing some of the many tours that Parade offers, as they can sell out quickly. (5) Take advantage of the Goodie Store presales as many of those items may not be found at the Goodie Store during Parade. (6) Should you attend the Concours and/ or Victory banquet, be sure to check the wine glass with your place setting. If the wine glass has the Parade logo etched on the glass, be sure to take it at the end of the evening, as this is yours. This glass has generally been a part of the Victory banquet place setting, but it has occurred at the Concours banquet (at least once that I know of).

The highlights of Parade are the Competitive Events – There are 4 competitive events that occur at every Porsche Parade. There is the Concours (Monday), Time-Speed-Distance (TSD) Rally (Tuesday), Autocross (Wednesday and Thursday) and the Tech Quiz (Friday). If you are interested in partaking in one or more of these events, read the Parade Competition Rules (PCRs) and be sure to classify your car accordingly. If unsure, try and find a knowledgeable Parade goer for some assistance – there's always someone in our region that can help.

Other features – (1) Parade Kids- there is an excellent kids program, so if you're considering taking any children, please do

- they will have as much fun with other Porsche children as you will with the adult Parade goers. (2) Meals - you can purchase the "meal package" or ala carte your meals. The Concours (Monday) and Victory (Saturday) banquets are sit down (with pre-assigned seating) meals and generally the Welcome Party, Rally and Autocross banquets are buffet style (first come seating). The local region working with the National staff tries to provide a list of local restaurants near the host hotel for anyone wanting to venture on their own for a meal or two. (3) Tours – The tours are great fun. They are a great way to spend the day touring around the area seeing the many sites this city has to offer. As with many big events, the "best" tours do sell out fast. Get on a waitlist if you really want to do a particular tour. Sometimes National adds another tour due to popularity and availability with the tour company. (4) Remote Control Cars – if you enjoy playing with remote control cars, bring your "toy" and join in this competition. It's like a mini track to "drive" around on. (5) Ice Cream Social – generally this is after the Rally event (Tuesday afternoon). You get your choice of ice cream and toppings and it is free. (6) Golf Scramble – a fun time to play with other Porsche golfers. You can just ask to be in any group or if you have a group of friends all doing this event, create your own group. National does try to handicap the group equally. If you like scrambles, this is a great way to play some golf. There is a good selection of name golf courses near this resort if you prefer to play a full round on your own time. (7) Volunteer Workers – like many events, volunteers are vital to a successful event. It's always a nice way to "get involved". Don't overload yourself with too many shifts in the same day. Be sure to get your volunteer card stamped at the end of each shift. That's your entry to the volunteer lunch party on Saturday. Lots of door prizes are given out at this party. (8) Parade of Porsches – this is a fun event driving your Porsche through the city's streets with police support for traffic control. Many town folks come out and watch the Porsches drive by. It is a nice way to show off your Porsche to the local folks. The

volunteer party will be over in time to partake in this event.

And, before you know it, it's time to check out and another Porsche Parade week comes to a close. Time to head back home and think, should we go to the next Parade??? 2021 will be held at French Lick, Indiana. National does try to rotate it's Parade locations around the lower 48 states and it did one in Canada a few years back in Mont Tremblant. I look forward to seeing you at Palm Springs in June.



Project Corner By Pat Norris

Follow along as Pat restores a 1972 911 that raced at the 24 Hours at Daytona back to racing form.

Now that the motor is out of the Franken-Porsche, I can focus on getting the motor in running shape - the initial problem of the oil leak can be addressed, and the pack rat nest in the fan shroud can be cleaned out.

Motor Tear-down

Everything on the topside of the motor was reasonably straightforward. Once the motor was out of the car, I removed the carbs, the wiring harness, and the alternator and set them aside. As the fan shroud was home to a lot of pack rat treasures, extra care was needed to keep my hands from becoming pincushions from the cholla needles. With the topside parts removed, I could see how big a job it would be to convert a pack rat nest into a running 911.



At the main seal end of the motor, the pressure plate, clutch, and flywheel all had to be removed to gain access to the seal. Other than needing a few specialty tools, removing

these parts went nicely. Along with the glaze from the suspected leaking oil seal, there was even more dirt and debris that had fallen down into places I didn't think even the pack rats could have reached.

The Bad News

After removing the parts on the topside, I found the telltale signs of busted head studs – in this case two of them. There were nuts with parts of the studs lying on top of one of the cylinders. This was not part of the plan. At this point, I decided to do a complete teardown and make sure everything would be fresh when I got the motor back in the Franken-Porsche. On top of everything else, somehow the cylinder with the two

busted head studs had water inside! This is not a water cooled Porsche, so this was a very unexpected development. Now there was no question that a full teardown and refresh was needed.

The Good News

After removing the camshafts, cam towers, heads, pistons and cylinders, I was able to open the case and see the condition of the internals. Inside the case was



oil-coated and everything looked in great shape! The bearing journals on the crank are still shiny and smooth. None of the rods looked to be damaged. Getting the case halves separated was easy, once all the case bolts and nuts were removed.

Next: Solving Mysteries

With the motor apart, and initial inspection finished, I am looking at replacing the pistons. Of course, here is where another mystery begins: Which parts were originally used to build the motor? What will I need to rebuild to get the motor running again? After some cleaning, additional inspections, and more research, I should have a good idea of at least what the big-ticket parts are that I will need to put things right again.

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
