Speed Bump - Slow Down For Some Automotive Tales

Saturday, October 19, 2024, was a great day for the Tucson Classics Car Show, held on the grassy field at the Gregory School. The weather was cool and overcast. A perfect day to photograph Porsches at the show. But wait, where were the Porsches? I only saw one, in a roped off area. I guess you could say that there was a Paucity of Porsches.

After I recovered from the visual overload of 400 fascinating automobiles, I decided my favorite was a 1927 Pierce-Arrow, owned and displayed by Bill Boris.

Wikipedia notes that the forerunner of Pierce-Arrow Motor Car Company of Buffalo, New York, was established in 1865 and they decided to build cars in 1901. In 1903 they produced a successful twocylinder model, the Arrow. From then on, the company concentrated on making larger, more luxurious cars for the upscale market. In 1909 President William Howard Taft ordered two Pierce-Arrows as official cars for the White House.

These large, heavy automobiles were powered by innovative engines. By 1910, 6-cylinders were standard. An 8-cylinder was introduced in 1929 and

a V-12 in 1931. The displacements went from 7.4 liters to the largest at 13.52 liters. The company also built commercial trucks, fire trucks, boats, and at one time, motorcycles and bicycles.

Quoting Wikipedia – "In 1914 Pierce-Arrow adopted its most enduring styling hallmark when the headlights were moved from the traditional placement at the radiator's sides, into the flared housings molded into the front fenders of the car... Pierce patented this placement, which endured until the final model of 1938. (The company was a victim of the great depression.)"

Local car enthusiast Bill Boris knew what he wanted, and he searched until he found it. He located this 1927 series 80 Convertible in Nebraska. It was family-owned and had sat in very good storage for the last 13 years. When he brought it to Tucson, he just buffed out the almost perfect body paint. The wooden hickory wheelspokes and convertible stays were in good condition. The 6-cylinder engine needed some new points and other minor tuning. Bill says he takes it out for drive every once in a while.

I have had a soft spot in my heart for Pierce Arrows. I grew up in the small town of Stafford, Kansas. When I was in high school in the 1940s, I would go to the garage behind the local Radio Sales and Repair Shop to gaze at the large, glamourous car that had imposing headlights that swooped down into the front fenders. A Piece Arrow in this farming community!

The Pierce-Arrow was in the middle of a line at the car show so Bill sent me an overall image. I decided to do a Photo Essay of this marvelous beauty to emphasize its unique features. A Photo Essay is a form of visual storytelling . Note the unique door handle and the square door for the golf club compartment. Please enjoy.















An Interesting, Additional Tidbit:

In 2012 I had permission to photograph the RM Sotheby Automobile Auction held at the Biltmore Hotel in Scottsdale, Arizona. One of the vehicles listed for auction was a 1920 Pierce-Arrow Model 48 2/3 Passenger Coupe.

I quote from the catalog: This remarkable Pierce-Arrow 48 was delivered new to Emerson Carey of Hutchinson, Kansas. (40 miles down Highway 50 from Stafford). Mr. Carey was the founder of the Carey Salt Company....In 1945 the Pierce was acquired by another wealthy Kansan. He spent nearly 30 years restoring it in an old garage in Great Bend, Kansas (37 miles from Stafford). Deciding to do "the unusual and create something really different" this owner.... covered the aluminum body with 23-karat gold. Every inch of the chassis and engine was covered, either in gold or nickel.... This restoration was completed in 1973. During that time and until acquisition by its next owner, Kenneth Mausolf, fewer than a dozen people had seen this remarkable car. In January 1974, finally, it was given a public debut , displayed in the lobby of the Bank of Englewood, Colorado.

This unusual Piece-Arrow has changed hands a number of times since then and a Google search was unable to find its current location.

The Spring 2024 Adopt-a-Roadway event was a success and I'm looking for similar enthusiastic participation again for our Fall 2024 event. We will fulfill our community commitment with an Adopt-a-Roadway event on Saturday, November 2nd. For many years our club has been committed to the Adopt-a-Roadway program as a very effective means of demonstrating our continued support to our community. The Adopt-a-Roadway program is part of the nationwide effort of sponsorship designed to help beautify our roadways by facilitating trash removal and saving the taxpayers of Pima



County approximately \$250 per mile cleaned which translates into thousands of dollars saved. Signage along our portion of Orange Grove Road clearly recognizes PCA-SAR's sponsorship.

This is a fun and not-too-strenuous task that will take about two hours of your time and will make you feel good about your participation in helping clean up our community. What else do you do for fun when you are not driving your Porsche?


I spend a lot of time gardening. We have a small vineyard of Pinot Noir grapes, from which I make wine.




