

And, each time I attend, I find the same thing I do with PCA events - you meet amazing people who just happen to have a love of cars, or in this case, racing.

I also hope you know how rare and magical it was to have virtually no traffic, and 16 cars basically nose to tail for more than 40 miles of the drive.



A Head-Start on Coming Helmet Standard Changes

Keeping Safe - Standards, Rules, and Dates

As the standard disclaimers warn us: auto racing is dangerous! To help keep us safe, most of the organizing bodies have minimum standards for safety equipment. And those standards are written, updated, and certified by external organizations. For helmets, there are two organizations handling standards - Fédération Internationale de l'Automobile (FIA) and the Snell Foundation (Snell).



FIA

FIA standards are considered the most stringent. And within the FIA standards, there are two applicable standards for helmets, FIA 8859-<year-issued>, and FIA 8860-<year-issued>. For automotive events, the FIA is the recognized standard in most of the world. The 8859-2015, and most recent updated, 8859-2024 are currently recognized. The 8860-2018 and 8860-2018 ABP standards are also recognized, though only required in the highest levels of auto sports.

Snell

Snell maintains standards to cover a wide variety of helmet applications, including everything from Equestrian to Auto Sports. For auto sports in the United States, including PCA, the last two SA<year> standards are applicable. Currently, SA2015 and SA2020 are recognized. A few organizations will recognize the M<year> standards, but the SA standard is designed for the type of impacts that are likely with an automobile accident. In practical terms, helmets meeting SA2020 have met the FIA 8859-2015 standard. And, so far the FIA 8859-2024 helmets meet the SA2020 standard. It is widely expected that the helmets meeting SA2025 will also meet FIA 8859-2024, but no helmets have yet passed testing for SA2025.

New Year, New Standards

Along with all the other stuff we get new for 2025 is the new Snell 2025 standard. These standards will become widely applicable as helmets meeting the new standard become available; currently expected in the fall of 2025. Additionally, PCA and other organizations in the past have allowed for a grace period between six months and a year for sufficient numbers of helmets to become available.

Standards and Rules

If you are in the market, currently, you should be looking at SA2020 or FIA 8859-2024 helmets for the latest standard. If you can wait, once the SA2025 helmets are available, they will have the longest useful life. If you are looking for helmets meeting the money-is-no-object, absolute toughest standards, the 8860-2018 and 8860-2018 ABP helmets are what you want.

Looking Ahead

So, what does that all mean? Well, if your current helmet is SA2015, or was manufactured over 10 years ago, even if it's in great condition, you are going to be in

the market for a new helmet. To keep current, you will need a helmet rated at least SA2020, or as they become available, SA2025. You likely only have until mid-2026 to get updated, so time to start shopping! Remember, your helmet helps keep your head safe.




